

Footpath Secretary's Report

There has been the usual steady flow of changes to the Public Rights of Way network in Leicestershire and Rutland over the last 12 months.

Many of these seem to be related to new housing developments. Whilst we can do our best to get the best result for PROW users the general loss of open space is concerning.

Here is a list of confirmed diversions in the last 12 months.

Keyham	D34, D101	Diversion to remove a longstanding obstruction
Catthorpe	X52	Diversion to remove a longstanding obstruction
Blaston	B47, B56, B57, B47a	Set of diversion onto better surfaces and additional paths
Broughton Astley	W44	Diversion to remove path from school sports field
Tur Langton	B7, B14, B15, A86	Minor diversions to realign paths onto better surfaces
Hugglescote	N55, N56	Diversion for new housing
Cotesbach	X27	Temporary diversion around quarry
Gilmorton	Y87, Y88, Y89	Minor diversions for new housing
Lubenham	A23, A24	Realignment of paths following housing development
Barkby	J1	The addition of the bridges over the brook.
